Typical Work Day

Seasonal General Laborers assist permanent staff to complete day-to-day maintenance and operational needs throughout the park. Laborers can expect to perform a variety of tasks including but not limited to general housekeeping and maintenance of buildings; landscaping maintenance and mowing; operation of power equipment and tools; use of hand tools; facility repairs; debris and brush removal; sign installation; and maintenance of flood control structures.



Position Requirements

- Ability to lift up to 40 lbs.
- Ability to work outdoors and indoors, and subject to inclement conditions.
- Ability to interpret and follow instructions and specifications.
