PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Control Tower Tours: Thursdays, January 17 and March 14, and Saturday February 16 @ 10:00 AM, meet at the Visitor Center Parking Lot.

Participants get a “behind-the-scenes” look at how the dam functions. Not only will you be out on the dam, but you will also be going inside the control tower. Be prepared to go down and up numerous steps. For those of you who cannot handle the steps you can go as far as the control room (about 20 steps).

Spotted Lanternfly Egg Scraping: Saturday, February 16 @ 10:00 AM

Come help Blue Marsh staff invasive species management initiatives by conducting Spotted Lanternfly egg scrapings before they hatch! Efforts during this event will help reduce this years Spotted Lanternfly numbers while providing data to managing agencies. A brief informational program on SLF egg mass identification and management practices will be held before we head out for the day’s activities.

Shoreline Cleanup: Saturday, March 16 @ 9:00 AM

Let’s keep our waterways clean! Come help us clean up along the shoreline before the summer season. The winter pool level allows us to access those hard to reach areas and items.

First Day Hike – Skinner’s Loop: Tuesday, January 01 @ 10:00 AM, meet at the Church Road Access Area.

Did you set some health goals for your New Year’s Resolution, or do you want to enjoy nature more? Start the New Year off right with a guided First Day Hike at Blue Marsh Lake. Join us on a guided hike through Skinner’s Loop to experience scenic landscape views with great wildlife and bird watching opportunities. The hike distance will be easy to moderate and approximately 2.5 miles. You will meet at the Church Road Access Area and carpool over to the Lake Road Access for the hike.

Old Roads and Main Trail Guided Hike: Saturday, January 26 @ 10:00 AM, meet at the Justa Road Access Area

Break out of the house and embrace the winter weather by joining us for a guided hike along the old paved roadways throughout the Pennsylvania State Gamelands and Blue Marsh property! There is a great variety of habitats in this area that should result in some great bird and wildlife sightings! Don’t forget your binoculars. The hike path is group’s choice between different loop variations in the area. Opt for an easy to moderate hike of just over 3.75 mile hike, or a more challenging 5 mile hike!

Ranger Guided Hike: Saturday, February 23 @ 10:00 AM, meet at the Visitor Center.

Come join the Rangers on a scenic and fact filled guided hike! Trek across the dam, through the Spillway and back up along the Tulpehocken Creek to the Stilling Basin while learning some history about the lake and why certain structures exist. The hike distance will be easy to moderate and approximately 3.5 miles.

Foxtrot and Shoreline Exploration Guided Hike: Saturday, March 30 @ 10:00 AM, meet at the Dry Brooks Boat Launch.

Get up and get out! The lake is still down and is perfect for exploration! Join us for a hike along the main trail and down to the lake edge to explore the area around the Dry Brooks Day Use Area. The hike will be an easy to moderate 2.5-3 miles.
