Option: New Infrastructure Controls

Description: Restrictions on the installation of infrastructure or new

connections to existing infrastructure as a means of controlling development; development of improved stormwater controls, including recharge basins, to manage

flood risk during storm events in at-risk areas.

Example(s): Limitations on the number of water and/or sanitary hookups

allowed in a district subject to flooding.

Benefits: Restricts human development in at-risk and/or

environmentally sensitive areas; can be effective in combination with other development controls; falls within

existing local authority; protects natural resources and

sensitive habitats.

Challenges: Applicable only to new construction or construction activities

requiring site plan approval but of limited effectiveness on existing development; limited infrastructure in waterfront area may reduce public recreational use and access; property owners may forgo access to public utilities; may result in undesirable aesthetic impacts; controls may adversely affect property values and tax base and be the subject of legal challenges for loss of property rights; requires public awareness/education and coordination among various

overlapping jurisdictions.
