



New Jersey Back Bays Coastal Storm Risk Management Study

Overview

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, in partnership with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, is conducting a feasibility study for coastal storm risk management problems within the New Jersey Back Bay area, defined as the network of interconnected tidal water bodies located landward of the New Jersey ocean coastline in Monmouth, Ocean, Atlantic, Burlington, and Cape May Counties. The objective of the study is to investigate problems and solutions to reduce damages from coastal flooding that affects population, critical infrastructure, critical facilities, property, and ecosystems. Some of the measures that will be discussed at tonight's meeting include structural solutions such as storm surge barriers and floodwalls; non-structural solutions such as elevating homes; and nature-based features.

The meeting is an opportunity for the general public and stakeholders to learn more about the study process and results to date. Participants are invited to interact with project team members at stations and to provide comments and ask questions (during both the open house session and the question and answer session).
